



TE IPUKAREA

Te Puna o te Kī

3 – 4 Hakihea 2015

Tēnā tātou katoa ngā kāhui rangatira o te motu whānui e ngākaunui ana ki tō tātou reo kāmehameha, tā tātou huia kaimanawa. Tēnā whakaopeti mai ki 'Te Puna o te Kī', kia ūwhia ki ngā wai puiaki hei whakaongaonga, hei whakakipakipa i te whatumanawa.

'Me kōrero te reo Māori i ngā wāhi katoa' – Kāti ake, me pēwhea e mōhio, āe rānei, kua tutuki tēnei kōrero? Nō reira, e ngā mana, e ngā reo, tēnei te karanga a Te Ipukarea ki a koutou, ki ngā reo o tēnā wāhi, o tēnā wao, o tēnā riu, kia rūmene mai ki raro i te mahau o Te Pūrengi.

He karanga tēnei ki te motu kia tahuri mai ki te hui tuarua o Te Puna o te Kī. Nō reira, kei noho tātou ka waiho te reo Māori hei kaupapa kōrero noa iho, engari mā te reo Māori ā tātou kaupapa me ō tātou whakaaro e kawē. Ka tū te hui nei ā te 3 – 4 o Hakihea, ki te marae o Ngā Wai o Horotiu, ki Te Wānanga Aronui o Tāmaki-makau-rau.

I te hui tuatahi o Te Puna o te Kī te tokomaha o te hunga ngākaunui ki tō tātou reo, waihoki, i tutuki te kaupapa i te pai o te noho me te whakarongo ki te reo Māori e rere ana i ngā kaupapa katoa. Ka mutu, kei te paetukutuku o Te Ipukarea ngā kōnae o ngā kaikōrero katoa i tū ki te hui tuatahi i te tau 2013:

- Tukua mai ā koutou tuhinga whakarāpopoto **i tēnei wā**. Kia **250 kupu** te roa o ngā tuhinga whakarāpopoto, mō te taha tuhi, me ū tonu ki ngā tikanga tuhi reo Māori a Te Taura Whiri i te Reo Māori, kei tā rātou paetukutuku.

- I roto tonu i tō tuhinga whakarāpopoto, tāpirihia ēnei kōrero mōu, arā, tō ingoa, tō wāhi mahi, tō imēra, me tō tau waea.
- E rua ngā ara e wātea ana ki te tangata, tuatahi, ko te tū a te tangata me tōna kotahi ki te whakatakoto i ōna whakaaro. Tuarua, ka whakarōpū mai ētahi tāngata i a rātou anō e pai ai tā rātou matapaki i tētehi kaupapa i mua i te whakaminenga. E whai iho nei ko ngā wā kua whakaritea mō ia ara kōrero:
 - Kauwhau: 20 miniti te roa, 15 miniti mō te kauwhau, e 5 miniti mō ngā pātai.
 - Rōpū: 40 miniti te roa, 30 miniti mō te wānanga, 10 miniti mō ngā pātai.

- Mō te rōpū, tukuna mai, kia kotahi noa iho te tuhinga whakarāpopoto, ka tāpiri ai i ngā ingoa katoa o tō koutou rōpū.
- Kāore he kaupapa e aukatingia ana engari e whāia ana kia rangawhāwhā te titiro me te whakaaro ki ngā kaupapa katoa, pēnei i te ao pāpāho, i te pūtaiao, i te hākinakina, i te hauora, i te aha atu, i te aha atu.

Whilst the Institute is committed to an ongoing dialogue about te reo Māori, including its status and health, this conference proposes an avenue to discuss wider issues and topics in te reo Māori.

This provides an opportunity to examine the role of the language in different fields and contexts. It also encourages the use of te reo Māori as a spoken language within the academy, a Western Institution. Furthermore, it offers an opportunity to publish in te reo Māori as all of the accepted abstracts and papers will be published in our online journal Te Kaharoa.

All persons who are able to deliver in te reo Māori are invited and encouraged to apply. Proposals are welcome from faculty and students in tertiary institutions; from community-based scholars and elders; and from professionals working in various fields related to Māori.

All subject areas are welcome and may include media, politics, education, law, sport, entertainment, and the sciences.

Abstracts are to be **250 words** and adhere to the Māori language conventions prescribed by Te Taura Whiri i te Reo Māori which can be found [here](#). Please include your name, institution (if applicable), and contact details.
